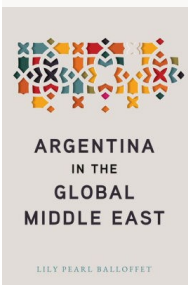

Lily Balloffet is Assistant Professor of Latin American and Latino Studies at the University of California, Santa Cruz. She is a scholar of migration, mobility, and inter-American relations in historical context. She is the author of *Argentina in the Global Middle East* (Stanford University Press, 2020), a transregional history told through the lens of alliances, solidarities, and exchanges that emerged from past migration booms in the Global South. Other research and teaching interests include contemporary Latin American hip hop, and social revolutions.



Discussant: Stacy Fahrenthold, (PhD, Northeastern University)

Stacy Fahrenthold is Assistant Professor of History at the University of California, Davis. Fahrenthold's research blends migration and borderlands approaches to social history, drawing on informal archives to critique the production of place-based histories.



Argentina in the Global Middle East connects modern Latin American and Middle Eastern history through their shared links to global migration systems. By following the mobile lives of individuals with roots in the Levantine Middle East, Lily Pearl Balloffet sheds light on the intersections of ethnicity, migrant–homeland ties, and international relations.
